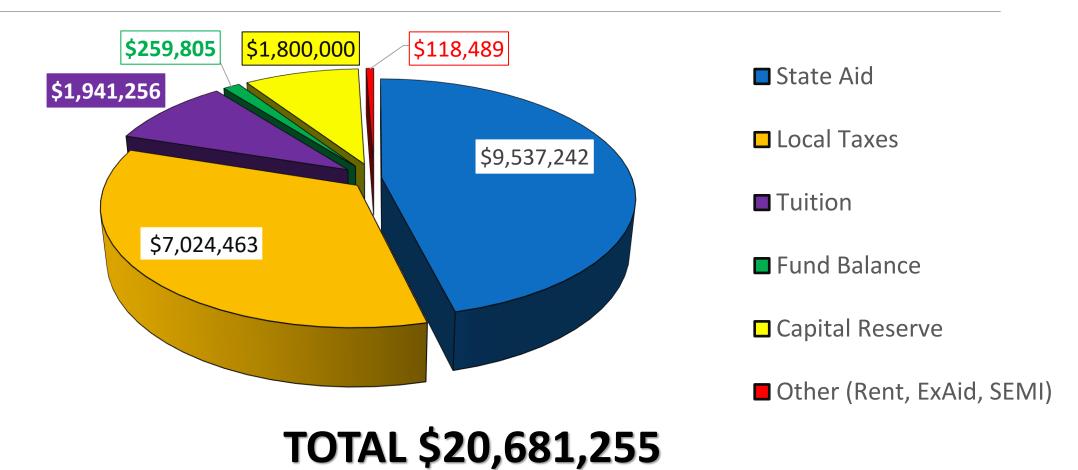

Tentative Budget Approved by BOE on March 24th
Submitted to Camden County Executive Superintendent on March 25th
Approved by County on April 12 <sup>th</sup>
Public Hearing and Final Approval by BOE tonight, May 5th

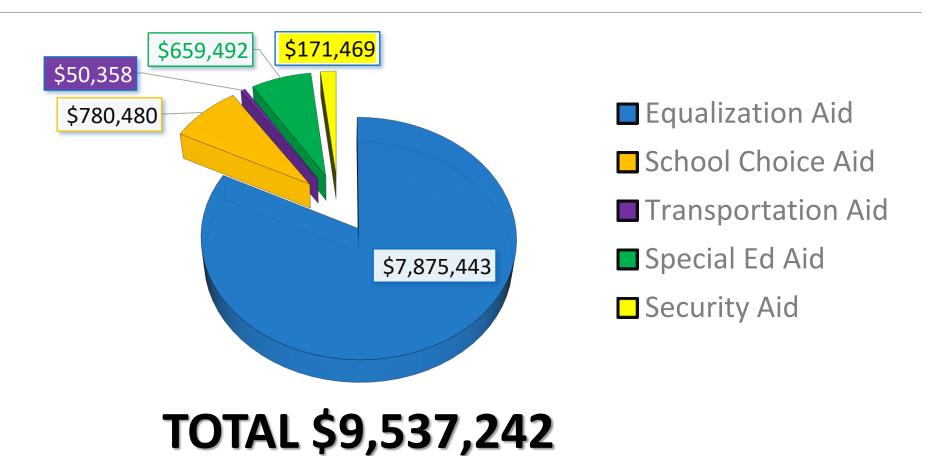

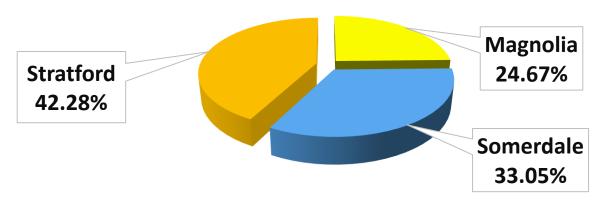
