



In order to graduate from Sterling High School, students must earn 130 overall credits including the required courses indicated in the chart below.

English Language Arts	20	English I-IV; English Composition is mandatory for all students to take	
Mathematics	15	Must include Algebra I, Geometry, and a third year of math	
Health and Physical Education	20	3.75 credits PE/1.25 credits Health	
Science	15	Life Science, Physical Science and Earth/Space science standards	
Visual/Performing Arts	5	See page 5 for a list of approved courses	
Social Studies	15	Must include 5 credits of World History and ten credits of US History	
21st Century Life and Careers	5	See page 5 for list of approved courses	
World Language	5	Students planning to attend college are required to complete 10 credits of World Language	
Financial, Economic, Business, and Entrepreneurial Literacy	2.5	Personal Finance
